- 2) No word yet on HB 168 (Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Grant) funding awards. According to Ohio RCAP:
 - a. Ohio Department of Development (Development) received over 1,500 applications totaling approximately \$1.5 billion.
 - b. Ohio EPA has reviewed around 170 applications and are supposed to start making grant awards by the end of October.
 - c. Ohio RCAP is not sure how the applications were selected. (first come first served or some other method).
 - d. Ohio EPA is to release their intended project list by early November.

We should know how to proceed with Cinnamon Lake force main and maintenance building project (WPCLF loan or WWIG grant by mid-November.

- 3) Submitted two FPA change requests to NOACA late last week
 - a. Two parcels totaling approximately 134 acres near the southeast corner of Butternut Ridge Road and State Route 301. Parcels have frontage on these roads. Developer asked LORCO to pursue FPA change so sewers could be planned as part of a development consisting of approximately 315 total acres between Slife Road and Butternut Ridge Road. Development would connect to our force main on Slife Road.
 - b. A portion of the parcel containing the Pine Brook golf course clubhouse and two outbuildings. FPA change request was for only approximately 6 acres of PPN

1100073000040 which is comprised of approximately 78.5 total acres. The 6 acres contain the golf course clubhouse and two outbuildings. The onsite package plant has failed, and the golf course is pumping out holding tanks several times a month during the 5 or 6 months each year that the course is operating.
